

DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY (DD) FLOW CHART

Includes students in the IEP categories of:

Cognitive Disability, MR, Downs Syndrome, Cerebral Palsy, Epilepsy, Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI), Autism, Autism Spectrum, PDD, Rett's Dis., Asperger's Disorder.

Contact the **Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC)** for options counseling and support services beginning at age 17 1/2 regardless of aging out or graduation (certification of completion). A student may meet the criteria for **long-term care** if they have a disability significant enough to qualify. **ADRC** will complete a Functional Screen to determine eligibility for long-term care. **ADRC** can also assist with resources and referrals for **Independent Living, Education and Training**.

A student applies for Social Security benefits online at www.ssa.gov. Students need to re-apply for SSI/SSDI at age 18 if received as a child. If a student needs assistance to apply/reapply for SSI and/or SSDI, contact the Disability Benefit Specialist at the **ADRC**. A student needs to be **Medicaid (MA)** eligible. If already on **MA** as a child, he needs to re-apply by age 19 through **Portage County Health and Human Services Department** 817 Whiting Avenue Stevens Point, WI 54481, (715) 345-5350 or toll-free (866) 920-2525. **OR Medicaid can also be obtained by the Adult SSI/SSDI application through the Social Security Admin. Office, 2213 8th St. South., Wisconsin Rapids, WI 715-423-3749**

In order to qualify for **long term care (Family Care/IRIS)** you have to be **Medically, Functionally, AND Financially** eligible. A student has to complete a Functional Screen with the Aging and Disability Resource Specialist. The student also has to be on Medicaid at the time of enrollment.

NO Disability Determination Other Resources

If you don't qualify at this time, other options will be discussed with your Aging and Disability Resource Specialist from ADRC.

Go through the Multi-Categorical or Emotional Behavioral Disability Flow Chart for other resources.

Revisit **this** Flow Chart if a diagnosis or disability changes or progresses.

Other Financial Resources

A student as an adult may qualify for other **Medicaid (MA)** benefits based on Income and/or asset limits. This public assistance may include Healthy Start, Food Share, Badger Care, Badger Care+Core Plan Medicaid Purchase Plan (MAP), Medicare Assistance Programs, SSI Caregiver and Institutional Medicaid.
